Course Description:

Provides additional expertise in an area of focus to support the work students complete in research studios. Topics and themes vary but include; Design Responses to Climate Change, Energy Performance, Historical Precedents and Theories, Designing for Social Equity and Inclusion, Life Cycle Analysis, Digital Fabrication, Simulation and Communication Techniques.

This course may be repeated for credit.

This course explores the use of the generative AI platform Midjourney as a tool for developing conceptual and aesthetic characteristics of your studio design project. Students will be expected to document and reflect on this process through a digital journal via Discord and the production of images and models.

Course Hours: 1.5 Units (in person)

Online Delivery

Students in this course will be required to participate in a Discord server for posting journal entries and assignments. Midjourney ai is a Discord based platform and students will be required to use in the course.

Course Learning Outcomes:

Upon completion of this course, students will know and be able to:

- 1. Understand basic concepts behind image generation in Midjourney
- 2. Document & Describe a process for conceptual development of a speculative project
- 3. Explore 2D image-based processes as the basis for development of a 3D digital assemblage
- 4. Communicate outcomes in relation to their research studio project.

Learning Resources:

Required readings, textbooks and learning materials:

There are no required textbooks for this course.

Students will need a subscription to Midjourney ai for the duration of the course. Subscriptions range from \$8-\$48/month depending on the plan and can be purchased via Midjourney.com.

Students will also need to have access to a Discord account. Students can register for an account and download the discord app at Discord.com

In this course we will review basic tools for getting started in Midjourney. The Midjourney server and youtube.com also have lots of information and tips and tricks for students interested in learning more advanced skills. - Attendance and Participation Expectations:
 - Students are expected to attend and come prepared to meaningfully engage in all class sessions. This includes producing or preparing content necessary for discussion and contributing to individual and class-wide discussions and/or conversations/assessments with the Course Instructor.
